

SU FORMA:

WOULD YOU LIKE + SUSTANTIVO?	QUIERE/QUIERES + SUSTANTIVO?
------------------------------	------------------------------

WOULD YOU LIKE + TO + VERBO?	QUIERE/QUIERES + VERBO INF.?
------------------------------	------------------------------

(literalmente se traduce por te gustaría/le gustaría).

Would you like a chocolate? – Quieres/Quiere un chocolate?

Would you like to come to the party? – Quieres venir a una fiesta?

SU USO:

- Se usa WOULD YOU LIKE+SUSTANTIVO, para ofrecer algo.
Would you like some coffee? – Quieres café?

- Se usa WOULD YOU LIKE+TO + VERBO, para invitar a alguien.
Would you like to have dinner with me on Sunday?
Quieres cenar conmigo el domingo?

- I WOULD LIKE (I'D LIKE) = quisiera, es una manera educada de pedir algo:
I would like a drink, please – quisiera una bebida, por favor.
I'd like to see the film on TV this evening – quisiera ver la película en la TV esta noche.

- No confundir :
 - Would you like...? I'd like = Quieres/quiere? Quisiera...
Would you like to go to the cinema? Yes, I would like to go.
Quieres/quiere ir al cine? Si, me gustaría ir.
 - Do you like? I like... = Te gusta? Me gusta.
Do you like going to the cinema? Yes, I go to the cinema a lot.
Te gusta ir al cine? Si, voy mucho al cine.
* Observa : **TO LIKE + VERB. GERUNDIO (ing).**
