HOW GRAMMAR WORKS

SE USA IT IS CUANDO HABLAMOS DE:

What time is it?	– Qué hora es?
It's one o'clock	– es la una.
It's two o'clock	– son las dos.
It's time to go home	– es hora de ir a casa.

TIME

What day is it?	– Qué día es?
It's 16 March	– es el 16 de marzo.
It's Monday today	– Hoy es lunes.
It's my birthday today	– Hoy es mi cumple.

DATE

How far is it from London to Bristol? – ¿A que distancia está Londres de Bristol?
It isn't far – no esta lejos.
It's a long way from here – está lejos de aquí.
It's 10 kilometres from here – Hay 10 km desde aquí.

DISTANCE

It's raining – snowing – Está lloviendo – nevando
It rains – snows – Llueve – nieva.
It rained – snowed – Llovió – nevó.
It's dark – está oscuro
It's cold – hace frío.
It's warm – hot – Hace calor
It's windy – Hace viento.
It's sunny – Hace sol
It's cloudy - está nublado
It's foggy – Hace niebla – hay niebla
It's fine – hace buen tiempo
It's a nice day – hace buen día.

FORECAST

IT IS + ADJETIVO:

- Utilizamos **IT + BE + ADJETIVO** con un tiempo verbal apropiado con adjetivos para hacer exclamaciones:
It's wonderful!
It was disgusting!
It will be great!

- Utilizamos **IT + BE + ADJETIVO + VERBO INF. CON TO** con un tiempo verbal apropiado con adjetivos para hacer exclamaciones:
Adjetivos : easy – difficult – impossible – dangerous – safe – stupid – cheap – expensive – nice – good – wonderful – terrible...

It's nice to see you again! – Es agradable verte otra vez.
It's impossible to understand her – Es imposible entenderla.

EXPRESIONES CON IT IS...

- Hay expresiones que utiliza la estructura IT IS, estas se colocan al principio de oración:
It is a pity/shame that you didn't win the race.
It's a good job that I had some money with me. (it was lucky)
It was a good idea to bring an umbrella – look at that rain!
It is silly/stupid/crazy not to do your homework..

- Podemos utilizar IT IS / IT WAS para hablar sobre la gente:
Who is ringing the doorbell? It is John.
Who phoned you last night? It was Mary.
 - On the phone:
Hello? John Davis speaking.
Hello John, it's Sarah. How are you?
